

INTRODUCTION: THE GREAT SOUTHERN ROAD

The United States is home to Route 66, the first of the US highway system, also known as The Will Rogers Highway. It originates from Chicago, Illinois, and passes through Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and ends at Santa Monica. Covering a staggering 2,448 miles (3,939.7 km). It is a challenge for tourists to complete the route and to explore and reminisce on the history of events that have occurred across this pioneering highway.

Australia can boast of its own pioneering Highway adventure that crosses the continent from Perth in WA to Sydney, NSW, a distance of 3,932 km (2,443.2 miles), almost equal distance to that of Route 66 with a comparable history of events and attractions along the way for tourists to explore.

The Eyre Highway, also referred to as The Nullarbor Plain, starts at Norseman (722 km E of Perth) and finishes on the SA state border at Ceduna some 1,675 km distant. From there it becomes the Great Ocean Road to Cann River in the Gippsland region and then the Monaro Highway. Only another 285 km to the Australian capital, Canberra, and a further 286 km to the NSW capital, Sydney, home of the famous Sydney Opera House.
